

1. MENTAL HEALTH AWARENESS

Nyanza Health Foundation (HNF) in collaboration with Healthy Nyanza Volunteers (HNV) carried out mental Health awareness campaign from the month of November through to the first week of December 2021. The education was done in Kenya and phone talks due to Covid-19, delta and omicron variant. Covid pandemic guideline and protocols were followed.

3. FOOD DRIVE FOR THE NEEDY

During the festive season families and friends always come together to celebrate, party and have fun through visits, travelling or organizing a home gathering or get-together. Unfortunately, in the community there are those who are unable to join or organize such celebrations due to poverty among other socio-economic reasons.

Reason for the Food Drive:

The covid-19 pandemic has caused many Kenyans to lose their jobs and small-scale businesses thus they were unable to meet the day-to-day family obligations. The food drive was initiated by HNF board members and carried out by HNV.

The purpose was to assist the affected families and reassure them that they are not alone in this pandemic.

The objective was to distribute food stuff to churches, schools, community centers and homes.

The goal was to reach:

- 50 churches.
- 20 schools
- 20 community centers and a handful of homes of families affected but could not go to church.
- 18 churches.
- five community homes,
- one school Nicholas children home in Nakuru, Kenya.
- Our Lady of peace Church in Darien USA received \$500 to help needy families.
- Food stuffs were bought and distributed in Kiambu, Nairobi, Nakuru, Kisumu, Siaya and Homabay counties to specific churches, one school, three community centers and St Nicholas children home in Nakuru.

The HNV also managed to visit three Healthy Nyanza Volunteers who were sick and gave them a token of ksh 5000 each to help with food and medication





5. KWANZA WEEK CELEBRATIONS



The Kwanzaa celebrations ran for a whole week from 12/26/2021 to 1/1/2022

. The purpose was to engage the youth was to remind them of their heritage and values as Kenyans and African America. The objective was to educate the youth on the 7 Kwanzaa principles and how they impact on their daily lives.

The seven Kwanzaa principles are Umoja, Kujichagulia, Ujima, Ujamaa, Nia, Kuumba and Imani.

To achieve the objective the youth were engaged in what was dubbed Kwanza Essay Contest. The youth were involved in, and essay writing contest and token of appreciation awarded.

Requirement for the scholarship included:


Student must be an Illinois resident and enrolled as a full-time student in school of Nursing.

Many community members have died at home due to road being impassable. My father the late Mzee Henry Ochong had atrial fibrillation that led to heart attack and Rae community had experienced flooding that night and no car would brave my home to take him to the hospital.

My father died at home. I was motivated to initiate the road improvement to help the Rae Community. HNF board, relatives and friends fundraised and got ksh 300 000 that was used for the road improvement.

The road is in better shape but still need more work.




LUNCH PROGRAM IN THREE SCHOOLS IN KENYA:
